

## **Cricket Hall of Fame gets donation of 49 tapes**

Lloyd Llewellyn, who is well-known in Hartford, Connecticut for his musical prowess recently donated 49 cricket tapes, most of them covering the 1999 World Cup tournament which was held in England, to the Cricket Hall of Fame. Jamaican-born Llewellyn, a lifetime cricket fan, compiled the tapes over a period of time.

Now retired, Llewellyn is presently in the process of disposing of more than 30 years of items collected between himself and his wife, who is deceased. He said that he is happy to give the tapes which consists of a number of memorable matches to the Hall of Fame so that others can get the opportunity to see some of the past cricket stars in action

A gifted musician, Llewellyn who migrated to the U.S. in the 1960s, followed in the footsteps of his mother, who was an accomplished pianist. A long-time member and organist at the North United Methodist Church in Hartford, Llewellyn has made and continues to make musical contributions to the community performing for occasions that cover a wide spectrum of events as he put it, “from the cradle to the grave.”

He is a member of the Caribbean American Society of Hartford, who at one time had a team participating in the Connecticut Cricket League. For several years, he served as Vice-President of the club.
