

Holding named Most Valuable Inductee

At a meeting held Wednesday, April 18, the Cricket Hall of Fame's Committee named former West Indian fast bowler Michael as its Most Valuable Inductee. He was inducted into the prestigious institution in 2004.

Mike Chambers, director of the Hall of Fame stated that "since his induction, Mr. Holding has exemplified himself as a true ambassador of the institution and deserves to be the first to wear our ring. We are hoping that Mr. Holding will do us the honor of accepting his ring in person, God willing at our next induction ceremony which is scheduled for Saturday, October 7, 2006."

The cricket Hall of Fame located in Hartford, Connecticut is this year celebrating its 25th anniversary. To mark the occasion the person adjudged as the Most Valuable Inductee will receive a ceremonial ring. Mr. Chambers also announced that as of 2007, each inductee will receive a ring at the induction ceremony.

This year's ceremony will be held under the theme "Founding Fathers."
